

**VIDEOTAPING UNIT IV:  
Teaching an Interactive Lesson and Responding to Questions**

For this assignment, you must prepare an 8-minute presentation (time includes answering questions) in which you include the following elements:

1. Greet the class and use rapport-building strategies;
2. Frame the class by noting what was covered in previous classes and providing an overview of what you will do in this lesson;
3. Develop a lesson on a concept, process or procedure through an interactive method (e.g., scaffolding problem-solving responses, leading a discussion) [At least half of the lesson time should involve a participatory activity of some kind.];
4. Involve students in the lesson by encouraging their active participation;
5. Use appropriate strategies to make sure you understand student questions and comments;
6. Paraphrase EVERY question, either to clarify the question or to make sure that the rest of the class understands what the question is, before responding;
7. Answer student questions and check back to see whether they have additional questions;
8. Close the class appropriately by summarizing what you were able to cover in the lesson and noting what will follow in the next class meeting.

Please attempt to include the following elements in your presentation:

1. Use students' names;
2. Move in front of the teacher's desk;
3. Check for student understanding where appropriate (At least 3 times);
4. Use appropriate body language and pay attention to the body language of the class.

Plan your lesson in advance. As you practice beforehand, try to take on the students' point of view. Are you presenting your information in a logical fashion that is most likely to aid understanding? Are you prepared to give a variety of explanations and examples if students do not understand? Is the task you are asking them to do a reasonable one? Have you considered how you will follow up if they are reluctant to participate?
